Pupil Premium Grant expenditure: report for Parents and Governors 2013-14

Funding received £89,000 (99 children receiving free school meals)

The Pupil Premium is additional funding given to schools so that they can support their disadvantaged pupils and close the attainment gap between them and their peers. It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility.
